Transportation

Employers are required to protect their workers from COVID-19 by:

- Implementing an effective social distancing plan in the workplace, providing six feet of space in between workers;
- Ensuring frequent and adequate hand washing;
- Increasing the cleaning and sanitizing of commonly touched surfaces
- Providing education to workers about coronavirus and how to prevent transmission in the *language they understand*;
- Isolating sick workers by making sure sick employees stay home or go home; and
- Establishing procedures for reporting a suspected or confirmed case.

Public transportation providers are expected to:

- Display signs informing riders they need to wear a face covering or mask.
- If a rider is not wearing a mask, operators should inform them of the mask policy and ask them to comply. The transit business may have specific steps for operators to take, but operators should avoid actions potentially creating violent situations.
- Due to the volume of riders within a given day, frequent cleaning and sanitizing of commonly touched surfaces is especially important on public transportation as is the use of hand sanitizer.
- Operators must also be masked. Since a face shield alone does not provide adequate protection, it must be paired with a cloth face covering.
